Typically located near the neonatal intensive care units (NICU), the Family Room provides families a place to recharge, grab a bit to eat, shower or sleep so they can stay strong for their children.



The Family Room at College Station Medical Center is RMHC CTX's sixth Family Room in Central Texas. The space is 1,000 square feet and includes a living room, kitchen/dining area, two bedrooms, full bath, laundry facilities, children's play area, tranquility room, technology station and patio.
