### Looking back, 2023 was an amazing year of growth and change for RMHC of Central Texas.

As we celebrated our 38th year, we served over 1,200 families across all of our programs. That's over 1,200 different families whose lives were positively impacted because of the generosity of friends like you.

We also saw enormous growth in our Ronald McDonald Family Room program, with the update of our Family Room at St. David's Women's Center and in opening a brand new Family Room at Dell Children's Medical Center North Campus. We consider it a huge privilege to come alongside families right there within the hospital, as they care for themselves AND their hospitalized child.

At our Ronald McDonald House, we continue to see an increase in our long-term stays, with over 30 families staying longer than 100 days with us in 2023. Our waitlist data also speaks to this growing trend, with 6 out of every 10 families on our waitlist at the Ronald McDonald House being turned away. Last year, we had a total of 499 families on our waitlist.

These statistics are directly correlated to the growing expertise in pediatric acute care in our Central Texas medical community. Families are increasingly traveling to Central Texas for complex pediatric medical care, and we must expand our program capacity to be able to effectively serve these families. We can only grow with you by our side!

So, with full hearts, we say a huge THANK YOU for your support in 2023. Throughout our Gratitude Report, you'll read about the tangible impact you helped to provide to our families as they stay strong for their ill or injured child. As we continue to partner together in the coming year, we look forward to sharing many more **stories of strength** as we care for families who need us.





### The Ronald McDonald House 2023 IMPACT



Our Ronald McDonald House is a 30-bedroom home-away-from-home, located in Austin, TX. For over 260 families in 2023 alone, it was a safe haven and crucial resource for families caring for an ill or injured child. Despite serving hundreds of families in need, this past year it became even more apparent that our current capacity simply isn't sufficient for the growing demand for our services in our Central Texas community.

## The **CHAVEZ** Family Story

The Chavez family, originating from El Paso, relocated to Austin to receive expert medical care for baby Emily's heart condition. Recalling their eight-month stay, the family expressed appreciation for the Ronald McDonald House's proximity to the hospital and the nurturing environment, which felt like a genuine home away from home. "It's been a huge help," they explained, highlighting the alleviation it provided by eliminating the need to plan lodging and meals amidst medical appointments and consultations.

"It's more than just a room and a meal," said Elvia Garcia De Chavez, Emily's grandmother. She recalls the close friendships they forged with fellow guest families, including their next-door neighbors at the Ronald McDonald House, the Villarreal Family, whose twins were experiencing similar medical challenges. These connections, Elvia expressed, provided invaluable emotional support during their extended stay away from home, and will continue to build even after their stay.

"I believe the people who come here have huge hearts," said Elvia, reflecting on the selfless dedication of volunteers who tirelessly cook meals and offer support. The Chavez family found deep solace in the nurturing community that thrived within the Ronald McDonald House walls, ensuring they could stay close to their child while also caring for themselves.









During their 8-month stay at the Ronald McDonald House, **baby Emily** and her family were able to participate in a variety of holiday festivities, including trick-or-treating as Little Red Riding Hood for Halloween and enjoying a visit with Santa Claus in December.

Having a baby in the NICU for 10 weeks is a nightmare. RMHC helped us and was a light in the dark.

We adopted our baby girl on Halloween, and I never wanted to leave her side. We live far away and the 1.5 hour commute was awful in Austin traffic.

I cried every day until we heard about the Family Room. Staying here has done wonders for our bonding and emotional coping! It almost feels like we are at home. The NICU nurses immediately noticed a difference in baby's health with mom and dad close by. Thank you for recognizing this need and providing a space to be a family.

Thank you for providing a quiet place to unwind in such an overwhelming time. Thank you so much! Being close to our son means the world to us. Thank you for making that possible!

We lived **over 3 hours away** and our daughter was going through a lot in the NICU. It was so helpful and amazing to have the Ronald McDonald House available to us. It will always mean more than anyone will know.

I didn't even realize how traumatized I was until the day I was told to be discharged from the hospital and leave my babies behind in the NICU. RMHC gave me **4 extra days close to my babies** which immensely helped in the transition to what was our new reality. It made a very difficult experience that **much easier to cope with**. We are forever grateful.

# Healing **HEARTS**

142 families served

**100** families in Austin received burial assistance

**19** families in the Brazos Valley received burial assistance

**23** families attended the HOPE Support Group

Our Healing Hearts program was created in 1993 to support families who have tragically lost a child. **In 2023, we served over 140 families.** The program, which is unique to our Central Texas chapter, includes offerings like the HOPE Support Group, memory gardens in Austin and College Station, and financial assistance for burial services and bereavement support. The HOPE Support Group is a free support group for parents who have experienced perinatal and infant loss. In partnership with other community organizations, RMHC of Central Texas also hosts an annual memorial celebration, offering families a special time to honor and reflect on the life of their child.



The memory gardens at the Ronald McDonald House in Austin and St. Joseph Health in College Station honor the life of the child by displaying a river rock engraved with the child's name. Families are welcome to visit their child's stone at both locations. The Healing Hearts Memory Garden at St. Joseph Health College Station Hospital provides a quiet, private space for families to gather.



# HAPPY WHEELS Cart

Our volunteers navigate our Happy Wheels Carts through the hallways of Central Texas hospitals each week, delivering small items of comfort to families and children: a sack lunch, a small toy, a toothbrush, or a warm blanket. Sometimes the snacks and lunches we provide are the first time a family member has eaten that day, not wanting to leave their child's bedside. Thank you for donating items to our Happy Wheels Cart!
